A September Sojourn in Kenya: A Week of Wild Wonders

A Note on Your Journey: September is a magnificent time to be in Kenya. The weather is generally warm and dry, and the landscapes are lush from the earlier dry season, making for stunning photography. The Great Migration is often in full swing in the Masai Mara, with massive herds and dramatic river crossings possible. All driving times are estimates and can vary with road conditions and wildlife sightings, which are all part of the adventure!

8-SEP: – INTO THE WILD HEART OF AFRICA

- **Activity:** Road Transfer, Masai Mara Game Drive at 0600hrs
- **Property:** Zebra Plains Tented Camp (Hill View Tents)
- **Travel:** Approximately 5-6 hours drive (270 km) from Nairobi to the Masai Mara National Reserve. The journey itself is a fascinating glimpse into rural Kenyan life, with stunning views of the Great Rift Valley.

Your Story Unfolds: After a hearty breakfast, you'll meet your guide and your rugged Landcruiser 4x4—your home on wheels for the next week. The drive to the Mara is an adventure, descending the escarpment of the Great Rift Valley. You'll arrive in time for a late lunch at the charming Mara Leisure Camp, nestled on the banks of the Talek River, right at the edge of the reserve. After a brief respite, embark on your first afternoon game drive. Watch as the golden light of the late sun washes over the vast savannah, and keep your eyes peeled for your first elephants, giraffes, and perhaps even a pride of lions. Return to the camp for a delicious dinner, falling asleep to the authentic symphony of the African night.

9 & 10 SEP:– FULL DAY ON THE SAVANNAH

- **Activity:** Full Day Game Drives in the Masai Mara

Your Story Deepens: Today is dedicated entirely to the wonders of the Masai Mara. You may choose to go out with a packed lunch for a full day of exploration or return to the camp for a midday break. Your expert guide will navigate the rolling hills and riverine forests in search of the Big Five (lion, leopard, rhinoceros, elephant, and buffalo). The Mara is also home to the Great Migration (depending on precise timing), a spectacle of millions of wildebeest and zebra. Witness a dramatic river crossing if you're lucky. Every moment is a potential postcard: a cheetah surveying the plains, a tower of giraffes silhouetted against the sky, or a solitary leopard resting on an acacia tree branch.

11-SEP : FROM GOLDEN PLAINS TO A PINK LAKE – LAKE NAKURU

After one last morning game drive in the Mara, you bid farewell to this paradise and begin your journey north. The road takes you back along the Rift Valley escarpment, offering final, breathtaking views. Your destination is the unique and beautiful **Lake Nakuru National Park**.

- **Drive:** Approx. 300 km / 5-6 hours.

Upon entering the park, you notice a change. The landscape is defined by the lake itself, which can often appear tinged with **pink** from the flamingos that feed on its algae. While flamingo numbers fluctuate with water levels, the park is a renowned rhino sanctuary, offering an excellent chance to see both black and white rhinos up close. You may also spot the rare Rothschild's giraffe. You check into the beautifully located **Lake Nakuru Sopa Lodge**, perched on a hill with stunning views over the lake and the park below.

12-SEP: TO THE FOOT OF A SNOW-CAPPED GIANT – AMBOSELI

Enjoy an early breakfast with a gamedrive view before you begin your journey to Amboseli. You journey south, passing through Nairobi and heading towards the Tanzanian border. The air grows hotter and drier, the landscape more arid, until a breathtaking sight emerges on the horizon: the majestic, snow-capped peak of **Mount Kilimanjaro**. Arriving in the evening with no game drive

- **Drive:** Approx. 380 km / 6-7 hours.
- ***You will have a stop over for lunch in Nairobi at a place of your choice.***

You check into the comfortable **Kibo Safari Camp**, where you can relax and reflect on the day's epic journey and sights.

13-SEP: KILIMANJARO'S REALM – DAWN AND DUSK IN AMBOSELI

Full Day: Another full day to explore Amboseli's diverse ecosystems, from the dried-up Lake Amboseli bed to the sulfurous springs and lush swamps that attract elephants, hippos, and a wealth of birdlife. Keep your camera ready, as the clearest views of Kilimanjaro often appear at sunrise and sunset.

14-SEP: KWAHERI – FAREWELL, FOR NOW

After a leisurely breakfast, you take one last look at the magnificent Kilimanjaro as you exit the Amboseli area at your own leisure with packed lunch. Our guide will transfer you back to the urban bustle of Nairobi. **Drive:** Approx. 240 km / 4-5 hours to Nairobi.

You will be dropped off at either **Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (NBO)** for your international flight home or a Nairobi hotel of your choice, filled with memories of golden plains, pink lakes, towering elephants, and the snows of Kilimanjaro.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

All visitors to Kenya must have a valid passport with at least 4 consecutive blank pages.

Any applicable Travel Documents are the responsibility of the traveller. For further information on Travel permit requirements visitors are advised to contact their nearest Kenyan Embassy or Consulate.

LANGUAGE:

TIME:

GMT +3

LOCAL SIM CARDS:

They can be purchased at the airport on arrival as they require passport verification. You can load our local currency in the M-Pesa app which makes it easy for you to purchase without getting refunds inconveniences.

WI-FI:

City hotels have it available in all areas but it might be limited the common areas in the lodges depending on the lodge.

POWER:

The city and Town hotels have 24-hour coverage but in the lodges within the parks, they always advise on when they put off their generators mostly at midnight and in the afternoon when all guests have left for afternoon game drives. For special considerations like CPAP machine use, it is good to notify the hotel earlier.

VOLTAGE:

220 Volts/AC50Hz. Sockets are UK style, 3 pin square plugs. Power is from the National Grid in the city/major towns and generator with inverter back up in the Safari Lodges and Camps.



CURRENCY:

Foreign currency must be changed at the Bank, Bureau de Change, and Hotel/Safari lodge/Camp/Resort. Major Credit Cards, Master card, Visa, American Express, are usually accepted throughout the country. Where credit cards are accepted, the payment will normally be recorded in US\$ regardless of the card's default currency.

CLOTHING:

Dress is mainly informal and should be comfortable as well as practical. Something warm should be brought along for early morning and evenings. Safari clothes are available from hotels/lodges/camps.

BAGGAGE:

Where possible, travel light. Baggage space on safari is limited to medium suitcase or soft bag per person plus reasonable amount of hand luggage. There is 15 Kilogram per person limit on all flights to the wildlife sanctuaries. Excess luggage must be stored in your arrival hotel.

WATER:

You will find many different of opinion of what is safe and what is not. We recommend for peace of mind, to drink local Bottled Mineral water. It is important to drink plenty of water especially during the hotter months. We would recommend that guests drink at least 2 to 3 litres of water per day to limit the effects of dehydration.

DRINKS:

Drinks are only paid for in the All Inclusive packages. Drinks are always charged separately from the Full Board package

HEALTH:

East Africa is a safe and secure destination; however, it is a good idea to take a few precautions. Kindly consult your GP or local doctor at least 6 weeks before you travel, with regards:

Malaria prophylactics. East Africa is a known malaria area and preventive measures are essential. You are advised to take one of the recommended anti-malarial drugs. Also confirm on Yellow Fever Vaccine compliance. Be sure to wear long sleeved shorts and trousers after sunset and spray the exposed parts of your body with a mosquito repellent spray

Remember to protect yourself from direct sun rays with sunscreen cream or safari hat.

DIETARY REQUIREMENTS:

For those guests with specific dietary requirement, please ensure the Hotel is notified prior to travel

GRATUITIES:

As a guideline and dependent on how happy you are, we would suggest the following:

The General Hotel/Lodge/Camp Staff - Approximately U\$ 10.00 per person per day

Driver Guides – Approximately US\$ 20.00 to US\$ 40.00 per person per day

PHOTOGRAPHY AND BINOCULARS:
